What is the Transit Development Plan (TDP)?

- State requirement
 - Includes the requirement for a Public Hearing

 Due to WSDOT September 1st
- Summary of prior year activities (2020)
- 6-year forecast of changes to service, facilities and equipment
 - A long-range model of service and resources is the primary source; TDP is a "snapshot" look ahead, subject to adjustment each year
- Description of how transit agencies will achieve State goals for public transit service



2020, A Historic Year

Fixed Route

- 16 new coaches
- Route 65 into NE Lacey
- Reduce, restore in response to the COVID-19 global pandemic

- 14 new vans
- Advance Reservation
